Adaptation Planning - National Adaptation Plan

An iterative process that includes many sectors, stakeholders and planning levels with cooperation required across institutions, management structures, and decision-making processes for designing, coordinating, implementing and monitoring medium term response to climate change risks and vulnerabilities.

Adaptive Capacity

The general ability of institutions, systems, and individuals to adjust to potential damage, to take advantage of opportunities, or to cope with the consequences.*

Institutions in the Context of Adaptation Planning

Policy makers, decision makers and planners who are working on adaptation planning are dependent on institutions with clearly delineated responsibilities and functions, backed by individuals with skills and knowledge.









Overall Aim of the Skills & Needs Assessment is to help Montenegro better understand the training needs of thos most involved in adaptation planning by:

- 1. Identifying and describing existing skills-sets in place:
 - The **Technical Skills** required to understand the science of climate change, issues of vulnerability and risk, and the prioritization of adaptation options.
 - The Management Skills required to organize and maintain complex social organizations.
 - The Participatory Skills required to promote and sustain cooperation, ownership and adaptation action
- 2. Locating these skills-sets at different implementation levels
 - Policy
 - Organizational
 - Operational
- 3. Identifying the gaps where additional skills development is required and then design and deliver training programs









Key Functions of Institutions for Improving Adaptation Planning

- Assessment on capability
- Assessment of coordination
- Information management
- Managing with uncertainty for climate risk reductions
